KENYAN SINGER PERFORMS LOCALLY TO BENEFIT AFRICAN ORPHANS

Award-winning Kenyan singer, “Kaz” performed live to raise funds for a Wellington-based non-profit organization with a mission to make dreams come true for African orphans.

West Palm Beach, Florida -- August 15, 2009 - Kenyan singer Karen “Kaz” Lucas teamed up with a local, popular Kenyan band, “Positively Africa” for a benefit concert where funds were raised for orphans and at-risk youth in Kenya. The event was hosted by Home Décor from around the World, by AfroCenter (formerly The Afro Center Gallery and Gift Shop) in downtown West Palm Beach. Over 75 participants enjoyed free, live afro-jazz music, a vibrant dance performance, raffle prizes and complimentary refreshments while they contributed towards the mission of a local non-profit organization, Dream Sponsors Inc.

Dream Sponsors board members presented information on their project in Kenya while featuring three specific orphans in dire need of sponsorship, highlighting each child’s dream and specific career goals. Guests also heard from Democratic Republic of Congo native, Fiston Kahindo, a Board member and active volunteer with the organization, who gave personal accounts of his tough time in Africa after losing both parents and seeking refuge in Kenya. Kahindo later found the support of an American family who helped him journey to the USA, obtain well-deserved scholarships, and therefore change his life by giving him the opportunity to be successful.

Kaz was visiting Florida for her first time. She arrived two days after headlining a concert in Atlanta, Georgia, which was held in remembrance of the victims of the 1998 U.S. Embassy terrorist attacks in Kenya and Tanzania.

Dream Sponsors board members are also working on plans to assist Kenyan professionals develop their very first official Grief Counseling Center. The organization welcomes volunteers, and donations to help more orphans. Carla Neumann explained that upon leaving the village they were given an overwhelmingly long list of all the children in just one school that had lost one or both parents. One goal is to get Palm Beach County youth involved in fund-raising and other projects, with the hope being that American and Kenyan youth will learn more about each other. Some high school organizations are already helping out including two local Interact Clubs.
